Sports Turf Managers Association Announces John Watt as New K-12 Director

The STMA conducts its annual elections electronically in late November and the Board officially takes office during the Conference & Exhibition.

Next year's event will be held in Orlando, Fla. Jan. 24-27, 2017. Additional future sites include Fort Worth, Texas (2018), Phoenix, Ariz. (2019) and West Palm Beach, Fla. (2020).
